

HOLY FAMILY

-Father Michael Gilligan, Ph. D.

Gospel Theme: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph are a model family exactly as Scripture explains: They prayed together, worked together, and stayed together. The unity they knew as a family is the unity we seek and the unity we need. May God grant it.

Sermon: In the Old Testament, Samuel was dedicated to God by his mother, Hannah. In fact, she left him at the temple in Shiloh. In a similar way, as a young boy, Jesus was in the temple, which he called "his Father's house." Jesus was bright, says the Gospel; he asked good questions. He was, the teachers thought, a precocious twelve-year old. Even then, he said things has parents did not understand. Yet, he was obedient to them.

In many ways, the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, are a model for our own families. Jesus, while a child, was obedient to his parents. Mary was reflective; he "kept all these things in her heart." As many women do, she would ruminate more than most men would. Jesus, too, advanced in wisdom; he studied. He advanced in age; he grew up. He advanced in "favor," that is, in the grace of God, the love of God. The father was responsible for his family. With his wife, he too searched for his son when he was not to be found. He shared the duty of caring for the family, not just for providing.

Today, in the United States, the family is under siege in several respects. Half the marriages in the country eventually break up. In every state in the union, no-fault divorce is available at nominal cost. Use of contraceptives is promoted in our public grade schools but mention of God is prohibited. Sexually transmitted diseases abound, in about a quarter of the general population. In spite of high use of contraceptives, extra marital pregnancy continues to rise; in some segments of society, it is the norm.

There is also a strong movement to see marriage as primarily a means of mutual happiness and social recognition, rather than as an economic union or the foundation of a new family. If sexual activity is always and everywhere something to be unregulated by law, then same sex marriage is legalized, as it is in several states already. But by that same principle, down the road, we may well end up legalizing whatever consenting adults want to do, including polygamy. In the United States, there is a growing number of gentleman's clubs, as well as other activities that cannot be described in a sermon.

Now, much of this is nothing new. What is different is that the Christian community is itself divided and in many respects as much a part of the problem as part of the solution. Some Christian Churches, with a great tradition, seem to be wholly absorbed by the culture in which we live. Other Churches rely on the Bible, as though it were an all-sufficient guide to every problem, by itself. If we compare our own culture to that of other countries, such as Sweden or Italy, there seems to be a comparative lack of family stability here. These are modern, Western cultures, much like our own. Yet in many parts of Europe, the family bond is stronger. There are also financial and legal incentives to make marriage work and to help mothers bear children.

Certainly, this is something we need to think about and to pray about. As numerous Popes have said, the family is the foundation of every society. Break up the family, and you break up the society. Support the family, and you build up society.

Closing Prayer: Father, we thank you for saving us through the family of the Church. Build up the families in which we live. Hear our prayers and keep us together in the grace of your Son. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
