SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Gospel Theme: The *Holy Way of the Lord* must be prepared. We return to Jerusalem; God returns to us. We are on our journey home.

Sermon: John the Baptist is the hero of the Gospel today; we also call him John the Baptizer. He was a cousin of Jesus Christ and no doubt his teacher as well. As a young man, Jesus was a follower of John the Baptist and a disciple of his teaching. In his words, the Prophet Isaiah was preached to the people of God:

"Every valley shall be filled; and every mountain and hill, made low." In other words, all nature would prepare for the coming of God, for the royal road on which the Lord would make his way. For people of faith, this was not a message of doom but of joy. "God has commanded," says the Prophet Baruch, "that every lofty mountain be made low, and that the age-old depths and gorges be filled to level ground." And this is done for a reason: "that Israel," the people of God, "may advance secure in the glory of God."

When 'the Messiah comes, says the Scripture, God's people will be reunited, reconciled, and gathered in unity. Yes, we know that Christ has already come; but we also yearn for him to come again and fulfill all these promises. We want to be fully united, fully reconciled, and fully gathered in unity.

In our time, we can see already a growing unity between the Catholic and the Orthodox communities. The Decree on Ecumenism of the Second Vatican Council did not speak of schism or heresy but rather of degrees of communion. Perhaps that is a more accurate way of speaking.

For the Catholic Church, in the present moment, there is already such a great communion between Catholics and Orthodox, that we should be able to share in the Eucharist, in Holy Communion. For the Orthodox, there is indeed a great communion but not yet full agreement on every important guestion.

For example, the role of the bishop of Rome is not yet a fully settled matter, between East and West, especially in his jurisdiction. The Orthodox Patriarch of Constantinople, however, has said that we have only to settle the question of the Uniate Churches, for example, the situation of the Ukrainian Catholic Church.

That settled, he says, we could return to full communion. In any case, for the Orthodox, the time has not yet come when Catholics and Orthodox could receive the Eucharist in each other's churches. But. we can pray together in many other ways and continue to deepen our existing communion.

To be sure, John the Baptist knew nothing of such questions. Neither did Jesus Christ speak of the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Rome. So, we have to recognize that we are dealing with differences that have arisen over time, with traditions that have developed over the years, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, within the Church, as Christ promised. That tradition will have to develop further, in the light of our tradition and our faith, so that Christians can be fully reconciled and that the words of Baruch and Isaiah will be fulfilled.

We must prepare for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness, that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Closing Prayer: *Father, Holy One*, we rejoice in you. Make known your glory, that we will serve you in full repentance, through Christ our Lord.

Theme: We have found the Messiah

On November 30th of each year, we celebrate the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle. He was one of the disciples of John the Baptist. According to the Gospel of John [John 1:35-37], we are told that, "The next day John was there again with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus." Indeed, the two disciples whose names are not mentioned are Andrew and John, the son of Zebedee. For it is mentioned in John 1: 38b-40 that after the two unnamed disciples asked Jesus, "Rabbi, where are you staying? He said to them, "Come and you will see." So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus."

This passage confirms that one of the disciples who heard John was Andrew. He left John the Baptist and followed Jesus and stayed with him for the whole day. One thing that stand out with Andrew encounter with Jesus is that; he was so impressed by Jesus and discover Jesus is the Messiah. For the first time in his life, he encountered God face to face and he did not want to waste this transforming and inspiring moment. He went to his own brother Simon Peter and told him, "We have found the messiah" [John 1:41b].

It is worthy to note that he used the plural personal pronoun "We"- "we have found the Messiah", instead of a singular personal pronoun, "I"- "I have found the Messiah." The use of "We" versus "I", demonstrates that the process of discovering and finding the Messiah is not exclusively a personal business rather it is a journey that involves many, a community of disciples or a group of people working toward the common goal. For John pointed his disciples to Jesus, they in turn followed and stayed with him and then they went and communicated their experience to others, like Simon Peter who also came to see and stayed with Jesus. Technically this is what we call the process of evangelization; for others hear about Jesus from those who knows him, then they take a journey of personal encounter with him and then share their experience with others and bring them to Jesus. The goal of the process is to bring everyone to know and found that Jesus is the Messiah.

Andrew brought Simon Peter to Jesus the next day [John 1:42]. He wanted him to know Jesus as the Messiah. He wanted him to stay with Jesus and to hear the word of eternal life from Jesus. The Bible teaches us that Simon Peter never left Jesus when he was brought to him by his brother Andrew. He found, loved, and decided to follow Jesus and he never did he turned back. The same invitation is offered to us in this advent season -ha to follow Jesus and never to turn back from him either by our words or actions. God bless you. **Fr. Thad**
