

FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

-- Father Michael Gilligan, Ph. D.

Gospel Theme: Today, Christ is revealed as God's own son by right. He is our King, our Lord, our Master, our Redeemer, and our Savior. O for a thousand tongues to sing his praise.

Sermon: Today, we celebrate Jesus Christ as the head of the universal Church, the Catholic Church, the whole Church around the world. In this great family, we Gentiles and Jews are members of the same body. In this family, we are light for the Gentiles. In this family, we are shining radiance for kings. Yes, magi, also known as wise men, bear witness to the leadership of Christ, the head of the Church, the king of all nations, all races, all peoples.

No doubt, you have heard about the thousands of Anglicans, especially in England and Wales, who are coming over to join the Catholic communion. In Great Britain, this movement has a dramatic effect. In many respects, the Catholic Church is enriched and expanded; in terms of practicing Christians, Catholics in Great Britain may well become the largest and most active religious group. There are perhaps 20 bishops who are considering joining our communion; the number of faithful is estimated to be anywhere from 400,000 to half a million.

It is not true that these Christians are coming into full communion with the Pope because of practicing homosexuals among the Anglican clergy or because of the ordination of women. No, the basic reason is otherwise. These Anglicans are people who already profess the Catholic faith; many of them have said for generations that they are Catholic, in faith and in doctrine. That profession means that they embrace the leadership of the ecumenical councils, that they share the same belief in essentials, that they value the traditional Church government of bishops, priests, and deacons, that they venerate the Virgin Mary, that they cherish the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, and that they accept all the official teachings of the Church. For such people, one would not speak of "conversion" or of converts." In many ways, they are indeed already Catholic.

Such was the case, for example, with the previous Prime Minister of England, Tony Blair. In his mind and heart, he was, he said, already Catholic before his full profession of faith. It is for this reason, when he was visiting Rome, that the Pope himself gave him Communion, with his family. As you know well, Holy Communion is a sign and a sacrament, not just of the presence of Christ but also of participation in the faith of the Church. That's what the Eucharist means. Both Tony Blair and the Pope understood this.

Why do we think of such a movement today? Because Epiphany celebrates the universal character of the Church, for all peoples, for all time, under the kingship of Christ. These thousands of Anglicans who will be joining us have different customs from ours, a different kind of English, and a different musical tradition. People who are Catholic now will be unfamiliar to many Catholics in the West. Such diversity is not a burden for us: it is a gift. Such diversity is not a cause of conflict; it is an occasion for celebration. Such diversity is not a denial of our tradition; it is a fulfillment of today's Scripture: Rise up in splendor! Your light has come; the glory of the Lord shines upon you. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you.

Closing Prayer: Father of Lights, we praise you for the full revelation of faith. We praise you for the wonder of your glory. We praise you for the light of your grace. Hear our petitions and bring us to the splendor of your Kingdom. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
