FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

-Father Michael Gilligan, Ph. D.

Gospel Theme: God's favored Son received his baptism as a sign of God's amointing. In this way, Christ received his mission from the Father, his calling as Servant, his task on earth. All nations and races are likewise called to join him.

Sermon: The baptism of Christis a symbol of our own baptism, which also involves the gift of the Holy Spirit.

I would like today to speak of two different understands of the sacrament of baptism was necessary for forgiveness of sins and for eternal life. In the fifth century, for example, St. Augustine taught that those who were not baptized would never be admitted to heaven. In fact, he taught that many, many people would be consigned forever to hell; he called them the massa damnata, the "condemned masses." For St. Augustine, the fall of Adam meant that our nature was very likely to bring us to sin. Original sin, he taught, was passed on to children by sexual intercourse. The pleasure of sex, taught St. Augustine, is something to which even married people should not give consent; it was a result of original sin. He called it concupiscence. In the early Church, because sin was thought to be so common, baptism would often be postponed till later life. You could only get baptized once; everybody agreed on that.

In the 19th and 20th centuries, it became evident that there were millions of people on earth who were never given the opportunity to believe in Christ; they never heard the Gospel at all. Furthermore, since Charles Darwin, the Catholic Church has been open to the fact of evolution. It is also evident that human beings have been on the earth for thousands of years, long before Jesus Christ. So, since God wills the salvation of all people, as Scripture teaches, would these millions of people be consigned to hell? Would they necessarily be denied eternal life with God? Therefore, in the middle of the twentieth century, the theology of the Church changed. At the Second Vatican Council, in the 60s, the teaching of the Church officially was altered. Now, the Church believes and acknowledges that God will save people as he wishes and as he intends; many of these people will not have been baptized. So, in the 4th Eucharistic Prayer, the priest prays for "all who seek [God] with a sincere heart." He also prays for the dead "whose faith is known to [God] alone." The liturgy itself teaches us what we should believe.

For this reason, then, baptism, confirmation, and First Holy Communion are celebrated today with a different emphasis. In all three sacraments of initiation, we want to focus on life on earth, on sharing in our common prayer, in regular participation in Sunday Mass. The emphasis is not so much on what is accomplished for the individual in terms of grace but rather on the beginning of a new life in Christ. So, with a child, we want to make sure that at least one parent or guardian will attend Sunday Mass regularly and bring the child, with him or her. We want to make sure that baptism is really and truly a first step in walking with God, Sunday by Sunday. We want to emphasize that baptism is a sign and a sacrament of membership in the community, in the here and now. That has always been part of the meaning of initiation; but now we emphasize that meaning, for the sake of our life in common. In this sense, then, we don't really prepare for baptism or confirmation or even for First Communion as such. Rather, what we are preparing for is regular participation in Sunday Mass, for the rest of life on earth. In fact, that is what the descent of the Holy Spirit means: the gift of God, in our common prayer and life.

Closing Prayer: God, we thank you for blessing your people with peace. Hear our petitions and help all nations to know you and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

As we enter the New Year, we pray that we may be blessed with Mary's trust and patience as we work toward that day when the whole world is joined in Peace.


