EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Gospel Theme: Each person speaks from his heart's abundance. What we think, we say. Sooner or later, what we really feel comes out. May the Lord be our vision.

Sermon: Never forget, the words of Jesus Christ you just heard: "from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks, ex abundantiae cordis." Boy, was he right. If you talk with someone, rather quickly, you know what is on that person's mind. It's true again and again.

- In the First Reading, it is said the fruit of a tree discloses the care it has had; so too does one's speech disclose that bent of one's mind. In English, we say, with the same meaning, it is better to remain silent and be thought a fool than to speak and remove all doubt.
- Upon receiving the peace prize of the German Booksellers Association, Vaclav Havel, the president of what was Czechoslovakia, gave an acceptance speech. President Havel spoke of "words on words." This man was a playwright. Here is what he said. "In the beginning was the word. So it is said on the first page of one of the must important books known to us. What is meant in that book is that the Word of God is the source of all creation. But surely the same could be said, figuratively speaking, of every human action." President Havel meant that words are the beginning of deeds. Words stand for ideas. And words matter.
- According to many, women are said to have better intuition. What does that mean? Perhaps it is that women can often more capable read body language. With all of us, words are expressed physically, with gesture and grimace, with expression and emphasis, with physical power. That's self-expression, in word and deed. As the Germans say, in Rat and Tat.
- Why do some people always criticize? Why do some people persist in complaining? Why do some deliberately not want to believe? They too speak from the fullness of their heart. That is why you must pray often, even daily. That is why you must read the Scriptures, why you must experience love, why you must study. You must have in your heart, before you speak a single word, an abundance of what really matters. In

that way, with goodness in your heart, you will utter goodness in your words. Otherwise, it is the blind leading the blind.

This is not always easy. This is not always possible. This is not always going to be less than a struggle. But thanks be to God, who has given us the victory through Jesus Christ, by means of Jesus Christ, because of Jesus Christ. We can be firm and steadfast because of his grace, abundant in our hearts, living in our souls, cherished in our Church. Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory. That is what the Eucharist is, always and everywhere.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Ash Wednesday is going to be celebrated next Wednesday, March 2, 2022. On this day, we will begin a long journey of 40 days of training ourselves to be holy as God is holy by focusing on praying, fasting and alms giving.

This day marks the beginning of lent; a period that allows us to meditate, contemplate and interiorize in our inner being the central mysteries of our faith, that is, the passion, death, and the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Lent is also a period of preparation for the celebration of Easter. It is a period of reform and renewal of our faith into a new life filled with the hope of eternal life. It is a time of experiencing Christ breath to his disciples and his followers; the breath of life, the breath of peace when he said, "Peace be with you". An invitation to be peaceful and peacekeepers in a tumultuous world.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday is a testament of faith, hope and a declaration that death has no power over the people of God; for Christ conquered and destroyed it. This is a time to celebrate the salvation that has been brought to humankind by Jesus Christ on the wood of the cross. For Prophet Isaiah said, "If he gives his life as an offering for sin, he shall see his descendant in a long time and the will of the Lord shall be accomplished through him." [Isa 53:10]

Lent is also a time of Catechetical preparation of Catechumens, that is, those who have not yet been baptized or the reception of the converted Christians into the Catholic faith. Normally during this time, Catechumens receive instructions of the Catholic faith, accepted into the order of Catechumens, elected, or enroll their names, undergo a period o purification and enlightment. It is a time of scrutiny and presentation before the celebration of the sacrament of Baptism on the Easter Vigil.

Therefore, I urge you Brothers and Sisters, to join me to journey with Christ in these forty days or lent. I urge you to follow his footsteps as he engages himself in an intense prayer life and fasting. Do not forget to include alms giving as one of the pillars of this journey.

I suggest that in this Lenten season, let each one of us choose a prayer partner or spiritual companion that can accompany her/him to grow in faith, prayer life, fasting or alms giving. I humbly suggest that each prayer companions choose two days in a week that they ay call each other for ten minutes only and pray for each other.

Additionally, when you call your partner or companion, share what you have learned from the Sunday's readings or from the sermon/homily and then share the best bible passage/line that has touched/inspired you to move positively in the journey of faith. And if you want me to join you in your prayer sessions, please do not hesitate to call, to email, to text, to facetime, to what app me and I will be one of your spiritual companions.
