

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Gospel Theme: Faith enables us to survive temptation, to obey the Word of God, to thank God for the gift of salvation. We are brought out of the desert, all of us, to a land of life and joy.

Sermon: Faith is the focus of our lives. Faith is the foundation of all that we do. Faith is the basis for right living, for hope, and for love. In the Gospel, the faith of Jesus is put to the test, the loyalty he owes God his Father. Note that the devil tempted him, and the devil quotes Scripture well; he knows the Bible. So, being able to cite Scripture verses is not necessarily a sign of true faith.

- Many of us are aware of atheists and their books, individuals such as Richard Dawkins and Christopher Hitchins. Well, how many of us are believers? How is it in the countries of Europe? Are Americans really more religious, as many allege us to be?
- Some years ago, the Gallup organization took a poll of various European countries, as well as the United States. The average percentage of atheists in Western Europe was 5%. It was 1% in Ireland, 3% in Scandinavia, 4% in Great Britain, Italy, and Spain, and 10% in France. In the U. S. only 5% of the people said that they were atheists, the same as the average of Western Europe.
- However, the same question can be put in different terms. In Ireland 64% said that they were religious; yet 82% went to Mass at least once a week. However, 83 per cent of the Italians said they were religious; yet average church attendance in Italy was about 36%. In the U.S., 81% said they were religious; 43% said they attended church at least once a week. Obviously, religion and faith don't have the same meaning in various cultures. Faith means different things to different people. But one important meaning, from the Bible, is loyalty to God, fidelity to his will, prioritizing values atha are believed to come from him. The Gospel today records that Jesus was tempted in his loyalty to his Father. Nonetheless, he overcame those temptations. He did not waver but held true to his principles.
- This Lent, we do what Jesus did. We do our best to

focus on what is important. We try to take a good look at our priorities and re-assess our faith. In the end, we are saved by God, by grace, by faith, not by the good deeds we do. Faith, we know, is itself a gift, not something earned or merited. This is why St. Paul says that the person with faith has a certain security in his or her relationship with God. A person believes and, in that act of believing, is set right with God, is "justified," theologians say. By the same token, we profess our faith in words, such as the Creed or the Eucharistic Prayer, that is how we are saved.

This Lent, perhaps 70,000 individuals across the U.S. are catechumens; with the rite of election on this day, they are called forward to begin the journey of Lent, the pilgrimage we make together to Easter. Let us pray for these catechumens and for each other. This Lent, let us prepare well for the celebration of the paschal mystery, six weeks from today. The catechumens are preparing for baptism; the rest of us are preparing to renew the promises of our own baptism. Let us begin that journey, in the fullness of faith, in the security of hope, in the abundance of charity.

The Beginning of Lent: A Time of Spiritual Revival

This week we have begun forty days of lent. A time of renewal and transformation of our lives. The mother Church invites all of us to pray, fast and give alms.

The gospel of Matthew in chapter 3:13-17 - 4:1-11, narrates the first luminous mystery of the Holy Rosary, the Baptism of our Lord Jesus in the Jordan. It is said, Jesus arrived at Galilee and came to John the Baptist to be baptized. He was baptized and thereafter the spirit led Jesus into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He spent forty days and nights praying and fasting. And he was tempted by the devil.

Indeed, Jesus was hungry, and his body needed food. For forty days and nights he mortified and trained his body not to give up to the world of material things but rather to the things that are spiritual and that which endures eternally. He fought against the devil temptations that enticed him with the glory of human cities, empty promises of the devil and to give up to the need of the body. He wrestled the devil and until the devil left him alone and the angels came to help him.

In these forty days Jesus experienced a spiritual revival or a spiritual power, for prayer and fasting connected him to the higher power of God the Father. From his prayer life Jesus developed an attitude of the mind that he is in the Father and the Father was in him. And so to speak he became intimately related to the Father such that he was united with him at all time. In our human language we can say, "Jesus developed a deeper dependency attitude with God the Father. Even though he was himself the second person of Triune God, yet he called God prayerfully in important moments of his life."

Therefore, in this Lenten season we are invited to come into this spiritual revival that Jesus walked through for forty days and night. We are invited to develop an intimate relationship with God the Father through a deeper experience of prayer life.

We are invited to develop a spiritual dependency attitude with God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit that we can do nothing without them. And that we are invited to join Jesus to train our body to hunger for spiritual things and not material things by fasting and giving alms.

May the good Lord bless you and you journey with Jesus in these forty days and nights of spiritual revival. God bless you.
