

April 24: Second Easter Sunday (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Gospel Theme: Unity of faith is Christ's Easter gift to his Church Forgiveness and healing and mercy all come from Christ, our Lord and King. Here at the harvest, love is living. Hearts on high we rightly raise!

Sermon: Around the world, people are joining in a common celebration of faith. There is a revival of Hinduism in India, of the Muslim religion in the Middle East, of Buddhis in China. But far greater than these is the marvelous renewal of the Christian community, over the face of the earth.

- The Gospel records two sayings of Jesus that affect our life today, in the present moment. First, Jesus says, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you," From Jesus Christ, the apostles receive their mission, just as the Son has his mission from the Father. In other words, the apostles teach and govern, because Christ has commissioned them to do exactly that. Today, in our lives, the place of the apostles is taken by bishops, priests, and deacons. Jesus Christ did not give us these three ministries; they developed early on, even in the first century A.D. But the leadership they share is not from us, not from our choice or our election; it is from Christ.
- The guiding principle of the government of the United States is just government derives its authority from the consent of the governed. We call that democracy. In 1776, that was a relatively new idea. But that is not how Jesus Christ speaks, with regard to his Church. No, the authority, the leadership, of bishops, priests, and deacons does not come from the consent of the governed. It comes from Christ, personally, as he himself says.
- The other saying of Jesus is also important. He makes it clear that the apostles can forgive sins. They can also, he says, decline to do so. That's what he says. In time, we would understand this commission as the sacrament of penance, of reconciliation. The same commission applies today to de denying individuals Holy Communion. Should they persist in sin. Again, this authority is not from the consent of the governed but not from Christ himself. This is not a burden but a benefit. Because of Christ's commission, God's forgiveness, God's mercy, is made more available to people, in ritual and in deeds of penance. This is a gift of Divine Mercy. The words of the priest or bishop, in giving absolution, assure the penitent that God bestows pardon and peace.
- Around the world, as just mentioned, hundreds of thousands of new Catholics are celebrating this commission of Christ, this leadership of the bishops, this forgiveness of sins. You heard the Scripture today. More and more believers, men and women, were continually added to the

Lord. What happened two thousand years ago in Jerusalem is happening today, in 2019 in Lagos and in Lima, in Hong Kong and in Kampala, in New Mexico City and in Moscow

It is Jesus Christ himself who tells us there is nothing to fear. I am the First, and the Last, the One who lives, forever and ever. As Christ spoke to John, he speaks to you, all of you, today. Peace be with you, indeed. Mercy be with you, indeed. Faith be with you, indeed.
