

APRIL 3, 2022 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Gospel Theme: God reveals to us something new. Now, obeying his Word, we submit to the change God brings about. We do not judge others, we do not linger in the past; we do not become mired in the present. No, we direct our attention to the finish line-the goal for which we live.

Sermon: For all of us, there are two kinds of faith. First, there is a calm, gradually growing faith, faith in human progress, faith in our society, faih in ourselves. In this sense, faith is the fulfillment of everything human. There's a second kind of faith, also familiar to you. This faith is belief that prevails in spite of the situation, in spite of opposition. This faith is not natural or easy. This is the kind of faith St. Paul talks about, again and again.

- For example, the great saints believed in spite of themselves. When popes were having children by many women, when priests were drunkards and lazy louts, when lay people were hypocrites and cheaters, a great saint spoke up. She was Catherine of Siena. She spoke up in spite of everything. Her faith was real. Her faith was a challenge to the established order. Her faith was a demand to change, to be converted. St. Catherine of Siena understood this well.
- Here's another example. Father John Smyth, a priest at Maryville Academy, an orphanage, once said he had seen so many turn out bad, because of their family background. Some kids just can't make it, he said. Yet there were exceptions. In some cases, people do have faith. They do live a good life, in spite of everything. Can it be that we are so formed by our environment that we have no choice? Do we ever do anything radically different from what our family has taught us? Do we ever do anything radically different from what our family has taught us? Is determinism the best philosophy? Father Smyth said there were exceptions, and I think he was right. Sometimes there is real, living faith that makes life new, that gives a new beginning, that changes everything.
- Sometimes, children turn out different from their parents; sometimes, they are acting in reaction to their parents.
 Even twins are sometimes different—so you know what that means. Environment isn't everything. We believe in free will, and we believe in grace. God really sometimes turns out to be the opposite of what we think. And faith sometimes changes everything.

- We do not live in a world that dominates us. In spite of evil, hypocrisy, laziness, corruption, we are not beaten. St. Paul said that his justice (happiness with God) comes not from the law but from faith in Christ. That means that it is not human deeds that make us right with God. It's God's own gift that makes us right with him. That's faith. That's justification by faith.
- St. Paul did not live as though the battle was over. He was running a race, looking ahead, striving for a goal. He gave no attention to what was behind—middle age—childhood failure—revenge—enmity—he looked to the future. Life on high in Christ: God says, "Look, I'm doing something new; don't you see it?"

This desert of life will be transformed. All the sorrow, all the pain, all the hurt, all the disease, all the illness, all the division. There will be an abundance of joy, of happiness, of pleasure, of delight, of good health, of unity, and of peace. "These are the people I formed for myself, that they may proclaim my praise." That's the Church, joining in the Eucharist. That's God's people, giving God the glory, the praise, and the thanks, now and always, and forever and ever.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Centuries ago, these Lenten days were a time of intense final preparation for the candidates for baptism. By now, they had already been numbered among the "elect" for Easter baptism, and were daily challenged to excel in prayer, in fasting, and in works of charity.

As is true today, at a certain point in the weekly assembly for Eucharist, the non-baptized were dismissed from the assembly for their own learning and prayer. While they might have had impressions about the Eucharist, they had no direct experience. The rites of the church were secret and its worship places off-limits.

For the Easter Vigil, those to be baptized arrived very hungry from long fasting, and perhaps very apprehensive as to how initiation was to be accomplished. A long night of vigil and storytelling, a shimmering pool of baptism, the anointing with oil and clothing with white robes came as something of a surprise.

At the end of a long, life-changing night of embrace by Christ and the community, as the eucharistic feast ended, a final surprise was brought forward. To address the deep hunger of the newly baptized, the church offered a bowl of milk and honey, sign of promises fulfilled, sign of community, prosperity, and peace, and yet another foretaste of heaven's banquet.
