SIXTH EASTER SUNDAY

Gospel Theme for Today: God's universal call to salvation extends to all people; so, from all who dwell beneath the skies, God's praise ascends. In the new Jerusalem, the Church, love and peace should reign. The Church is our Mother; she brings us freedom and eternal joy.

Sermon: The mystery of Easter, the paschal sacrament, is also the mystery of the Church, the sacrament of the Church. In today's Gospel, Jesus says. that the Holy Spirit "will instruct you in everything." In other words, God our Father will send to the Church his very presence, his Spirit, in the community.

- So, when thee was dissension, the leaders of the Church in Jerusalem said what seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to them. In this way, the leaders of the Church claimed to speak with the authority of God, present in the Church. The leaders said that Gentiles should be welcomed into the community without being circumcised. This was in accord with the covenant that God made with Noah, after the great flood.
- What is important to us today is precisely that kind of leadership. Note that it is not a question of Bible interpretation. The leaders of the Church do not cite chapter and verse; they do not express reliance on the Scripture. Rather, they say, "It has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us." Then, these leaders send "leading men" from Jerusalem to pass on this message. Today, when the bishops speak, they speak with the same authority. They may will quote Scripture, but that's not the point. When the bishops teach, it is not that they are interpreting the Bible. It is that they are speaking on the authority of Christ.
- In our time, theologians and bishops together study the faith and do their best to determine what the faith implies. A recent discovery of the Orthodox, when they deal with Catholics, is that they say, "Well, it seems that they are really Orthodox." Similarly, when the Catholics meet with the Orthodox, they say, "Well, it seems that they are really Catholic." So it has come to pass. Through prayer, through humility through an openness to the Spirit, through serious study, through examination of the sources of our tradition, through our own history, we discover in each other the one, true faith.
- Now, such a growing consensus applies to the teaching of the Creed, to the central elements of the faith, to
 the authority of Scripture, to the power of the sacraments, to the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, to the

veneration of the saints, to the effect of God's grace. In such matters. East and West see the gift of the Holy Spirit more clearly.

As Christian unity grows and develops, it will be because the will of Christ is manifest to our leaders, that there should be one flock and one shepherd, that the Gentiles are welcome, that any racial or cultural divide should not impair our common unity. Let us thank God, then, that the Holy Spirit is bringing us together. This is the gift of the risen Christ.

He has served as Chair of the Association of Chicago Priests (ACP) and as editor of UPTURN, a bimonthly publication of the ACP. He is a published writer, making contributions to wounds of child and youth sexual abuse. He is an avid reader, backpacker, hiker and bicyclist.

THE SEED OF DESTRUCTION: GUN VIOLENCE AND MASS SHOOTINGS IS A CRIME AGAINST HUMANITY

In this past week, cities across America, from Buffalo in New York, Milwaukee in Wisconsin, Laguna Woods in California, Winston-Salem in North Carolina, Amarillo & Houston in Texas, to our own city of Chicago in Illinois, we have seen uprising of gun violence and mass shootings in public areas. We pray for the repose of those who died in these mass shootings and the recovery for those wounded and injured.

These mass shootings have been motivated by white supremacists' racial bias, racial hatred, gang confrontations or fights between groups etc. It is saddening and terrifying to see public places like parks, schools, churches, supermarkets, movie theatres and night clubs become places of targets for these heinous crimes against humanity. Currently it is not certain that these spaces are safe places to be.

The action of a gunman of 18 years with white supremacist mentality, who travelled 200 miles to Buffalo-NY, to target and kill African Americans while livestreaming his disgusting actions, deeply saddens and troubles most of us. We the community of hope, faith, and love, condemn these odious, inhuman, and abhorrent actions against Black people, other people of different races, and creed. Indeed, Cardinal Cupich in his statement regarding the Buffalo mass killing said, "On Saturday, May 14, a gunman used an AR-15, high-capacity assault weapon to murder 10 Black Americans at a Buffalo grocery store, wounding two bystanders. Many of his victims were near or beyond retirement age, including Pearl Young, 77, a grandmother of eight who taught Sunday school, and Katherine Massey, 72, a civil-rights advocate who had written in favor of stronger gun-safety laws." This is sad news.

These acts of mass shootings and gun violence create fear and terror in our community. The acts plant a seed of destruction that destroys the God given gift of life from innocent people, inflicts unbearable wounds and pains to the people of color. Certainly, the enemy wants to create fear and terror among the people of color that they may not continue to fight for their dignity, rights, and freedom. But the enemy is wrong, because the fight for freedom, dignity and rights will continue no matter what. There is no retreat and there is no going back. Aluta continua – the struggle/fight continue for racial justice.

Now, Thomas Merton, in his book "The Seed of Destruction, once said "If you are knowingly responsible for laws that will systematically be violated, then you are partly to blame for the disorders and the confusion..." Therefore, I am not ashamed to say today, "gun manufacturers you are responsible for these crimes; Law makers, you are responsible for these atrocious acts; and you who keep silence, you are responsible for the lives that have been lost, for the pain, and wounds of the innocent people. You are responsible.
