FOURTH EASTER SUNDAY (MOTHER'S DAY)

Gospel Theme for Today: Christ is the Shepherd, our leader, and Lord, the Lamb of God. At his high feast, the Eucharist, we acknowledge Jesus as our Prophet, our Priest, and our eternal King. As Shepherd, Christ leads us to heaven. He is closer to us than even Mary or any one of the saints. Christ is near to us to heaven. He is closer to us than even Mary or any one of the saints. Christ is near to us in the Gospel, in the sacraments, and in in his Church. Together with Mary, with the saints, we go to God through Christ. This is the spirit of the liturgy, the teaching of the Church.

Sermon: In the First Reading, you heard how St. Paul and St. Barnabas preached the Word, how the town of Antioch turned out to hear them, how the Gentiles gave them a welcome reception, and how the Jewish leaders got them thrown out of town. In Antioch, many Gentiles accepted the faith and believed in Jesus as the Messiah. In part, local Jews may have rejected Paul and Barnabas precisely because Jews did not want to Associate with Gentiles.

- Scripture says that when "the Jews" saw the crowds coming to hear the apostles, the Jews were jealous and angry. Now, who are these "Jews"? Are not Paul and Barnabas Jews? Are they not teaching in a synagogue? Are not the people listening also Jews? Of course! All of them were Jews. The Bible text should rather say, "Jewish leaders." It was the leaders who were jealous. Here's what happened and why.
- The Acts of the Apostles was written after the Gospel of Luke, after the fall of Jerusalem. The cause of this Roman persecution, the reason the city was destroyed, was the widespread movement in favor of a Messiah. There were plenty of Jewish people who thought that the Messiah was coming soon, someone who would overturn the Roman authority and set up a new, Jewish kingdom. Therefore, the Romans arrested anybody who might claim to be this Messiah. To suppress any revolt, the Romans wiped out the whole city of Jerusalem, every man, woman, and child.
- After this disaster, the rabbis decided that this Messiah business should be put on the shelf. In fact, the rabbis threw he followers of Jesus out of the synagogue, along with any others who promoted the coming of the Messiah. For the first time in Jewish history, some Jews were publicly and officially expelled from the community. This had never happened before and has never happened since.
- There are all kinds of Jews, with all kinds of different theologies. But the Messianic Jews, the ones who looked for a Messiah or who thought Jesus was the Messiah, they were excommunicated and rejected. Naturally, the followers of Jesus themselves were hurt and angry. That's why the Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of John speak of "the Jews." There is already severe antagonism and bitterness.
- In a way, the rabbis had no choice. It was obvious that the Romans would crack down on any Jews who favored a Messiah. The leaders were not just anti-Christian; they were against anyone would bring their community into danger. With Roman le-

gions everywhere, the Jewish people were in mortal peril.

In a way, then, this story tells us how the Church began, with an opening to the Gentiles, the uncircumcised, Greek-speaking pagans. The Church began to grow, precisely from a group of people who were either rejected by their own or who were outsiders to begin with. From failure comes ultimate success. From sin comes abundant grace. From sorrow comes everlasting happiness. We honor mothers and grandmothers today, because so often their love is without limit. In the same way, the unlimited love of the Church will foster her unity and peace.
