IN ORDINARY TIME

Gospel Theme for Today Peace to Jerusalem; the fullness of our joy is ours to share. We are proud of our destiny, the glory of the Cross. The Lord Jesus, the Savior, brings happiness to his people. We invited all people to come where the wind is free, where God's spirit is living.

You just heard the Gospel of Christ. He says that you are to be ambassadors of peace. Jesus Christ sent out his disciples, two by two, ahead of him. They were to prepare the way for his arrival in a given town or village. The disciples were to say to the head of household "Peace to this household." If the man or woman was peaceful, the peace offered would rest on that person, says the Gospel. If the man or woman was not peaceful, the peace would return to the disciples. What does this mean?

How does peace come and go like that? Is it not a state of mind, a condition of being? Is it not an attitude of the spirit? Is it not a set of behaviors, a way of living? Perhaps that is what Jesus Christ means. If we wish peace upon someone or some group, our wish may be accepted or rejected. But the wish or even the prayer will not work by itself; it must be received.

You know this is how the world works. Some people just can't accept peace. They are hostile or argumentative of selfish or narcissistic or upset or depressed or hurt. It doesn't matter what you say. They will only respond with hostility.

Jesus Christ, in today's Gospel, is telling us something important. So often you can't fix people; you can't change them; you can't make them behave the way you think they should behave. In this case Christ is telling his disciples, and he is telling us something new. He says that you have to remember that you are lambs among wolves. There are plenty of people out there who are thieves, predators, manipulators. You're not going to change them. Move on. Is there not much wisdom in that?

So many young women, it is said, think that they will change their boyfriends. They think that they can fix them. It just doesn't work. One wag put it this way. He said that men marry and think that their beautiful wives will never change, but they do. From another perspective, women marry and think that their husbands will change and they didn't. This is part of the reason why marriages are not always perfect and why families are not always places of peace.

In another sphere of life, the military efforts of our armed forces, it is much that the same. Several years ago, people said that we had we had to invade Iraq, in order to establish democracy in that country. Once we removed the evil dictator, it was said, people would joyfully embrace equal rights for all. People would give women equal opportunity. People all over the world, it was said, want freedom. So, we Americans would invade, set up democracy there; and the whole Middle East would begin to change. Several years ago, that is what many people said. Nobody says that now.

There is no questions that we have the finest armed forces in the world, the best technology, the most efficient war machine the world has ever seen. So, after a quick battlefield victory, with mission accomplished, have we won the peace for which we fought? Nobody says that now.

Like the kamikaze suicide pilots of the desperate Japanese in 1945, we are now faced with thousands of people who are ready and willing to commit suicide to achieve their ends. We Americans don't understand this. We find it difficult to believe that religion could actually be a vital force in a culture. We don't understand that people's hearts and minds are different from ours. Let us indeed pray for peace. But let us also pray for wisdom. Let us learn from the Gospel of Christ, the Gospel that points to a better way.

Priest: God, we thank you taking care of us like a mother, for loving us and giving us strength. Hear our prayers and grant us your peace, through Christ our Lord.
