#### From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My brothers and sisters, I want to begin this reflection by quoting the invitation of St. Paul to us this Sunday: *Brothers and sisters: Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith.* (Hebrews 12:1-2) I am always encouraged by the knowledge that there is a great cloud of witnesses, the Communion of Saints, always praying for us and urging us on. This knowledge of their presence with us as part of our congregations at every Mass reassures me that a multitude of prayers are being prayed for all of us as we seek to live our lives faithfully that we may join them one day in the joy of eternal, ever life-giving love.

But as we all well know not everyone is wholly committed to the discipleship and servanthood that the Lord asks of each and all of us. Our society has promoted division in a multitude of ways, always to serve the egos, the craving for power, prestige and material wealth, the need to feel superior to others, the need to cling to the past and not be open to an even more promising future for ourselves and our descendants.

This division has never been so evident as in our politics. Since 9/11 political forces have played on the fears of all of us to truly divide us, even within our families. I can personally attest to this. So when Jesus says he came to sow division, it was to let his disciples know that his message and lived example of selfless love, especially for the poor and all those marginalized in our society, would challenge those who sought to preserve their power and those who could not fathom or who never experienced unconditional love.

We know in our hearts that this sort of selfless love challenges us, especially when we choose doing selfish or hurtful things to others. Therefore, we need to honestly look at the divisions within ourselves. In order to address the divisions in our society, we must at the same time address the divisions within us individually. We need to ask the question: What attitudes, behaviors do I cling to that prevent me from offering my gifts of time, talent and treasure for the good of my family, friends, fellow parishioners, the poor and needy?

The divisions that limit our living true discipleship in Jesus Christ are often within us! Jesus himself offers us all we need to bridge and heal those divisions. He then offers us all we need to bridge and heal the divisions in our families and communities. The key is our acknowledgment of those divisions and the sincere pursuit of healing and wholeness in a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. **Gentle Peace! Fr. Larry**

A Special Note from Kolbe House This weekend we celebrate the feast day of St. Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish Franciscan priest who was

imprisoned and executed at Auschwitz in 1941. His presence brought peace and hope to the other prisoners as he ministered to them and prayed with them. He voluntarily offered his life so that a complete stranger, a man with a wife and children, could live.

Among his words of counsel to other prisoners was the phrase, "Love alone creates." At Kolbe House, we lift these words as a guiding light amidst a prison system often devoid of love. We know that hatred and revenge destroy us, while love creates healing, reconciliation, and communion.

Through our ministries inside Cook County jail, writing letters to Illinois prisons, and walking alongside families and individuals recently released from incarceration, we strive to bear witness to God's presence there and, through our encounters, allow God's love to multiply.

Without your parish's generous, faithful support of our ministry, this work would not be possible. We are so grateful for your confidence and we commit to working together to build communities of peace, hope, and reconciliation. Thank you!
