



**RCIA:** Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

**Marriage:** Please contact the parish office before setting your date. The Church asks that couples be parish members for at least 6 months before setting a date. Participation in Pre-Cana and a Premarital Inventory required.

From the Desk of Fr. Larry... My friends, the Scriptures help us understand the meaning of what true discipleship means for those of us who call ourselves followers of Jesus Christ. There are those who admire Jesus as a great teacher, a worker of miracles, a good role model. They live their lives at arms-distance from Jesus, unwilling to make the necessary sacrifices to be a true follower. There are Christians who, when pressed, are unable to describe their personal relationship with Jesus or talk about an encounter they have had with the presence of Jesus. There are those who claim to be Christians who do good things for others, but do so out of a selfish motivation for praise and status. And then there are those who call themselves Christian who strive every day to draw closer to Jesus, to have the discipline to sit at the Lord's feet and seek to understand how the Lord is instructing them in how to live faithful, humble and selfless lives.

Today's Gospel describes the one group, those who are rejected from entry into the Master's home, those who claim to have done good works in His name, but who He claims not to know because their motivation was selfish, lacking in a sincere connection to Him.

St. Paul focuses us on our openness to be taught or disciplined by the Lord. We know that discipline is different than punishment. We live very much in a punitive society, focused more on tearing down than forgiving and lifting up. St. Paul makes it clear that we will make mistakes in trying to follow Jesus, that we will falter and fall. But, as any good parent, Jesus offers us a path toward reconciliation and restoration.

Growing up with 8 siblings, we all made our fair share of mistakes. My parents would typically punish us by spanking or the use of a willow branch - which we had to go and get from the tree in our yard, to whip us on our bare legs. Later on as we grew, their discipline became more about sitting us down and helping us express what we did wrong, making sure we learned from our mistakes with the assurance that we would not repeat our offense. Sunday's Scriptures invite us to assess our own discipline in following the Lord. Do we communicate daily with Jesus in prayer, not only offering our requests but also our gratitude, and inviting the Lord to speak to us as well? Do we reflect on the Scriptures every day or at least look up the Scriptures for the coming Sunday and reflect on them before coming to Mass? Do we open our hearts and minds to those human encounters or encounters in nature where the Lord may be seeking to teach us or draw us to service of those in need? Or do we hold the Lord at arm's length, continuing to live our lives as we choose and not always as the Lord would have us do? Or do we tell people that we are Christian and then give scandal to our faith and to Jesus by doing things that are anything but Christian? My prayer is that all of us may strive to grow closer to the Lord every day. If we do so, the Lord promises us all that we need to live full and faithful lives... and what more can any of us really want in life? **Gentle Peace!** Fr. Larry
