



From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My friends, many believe that the opposite of love is hate. However, I believe that the opposite of love is exhibited more clearly in today's Gospel of Lazarus and the rich man. In this story, we are given no reason to believe that the rich man hates Lazarus, the poor man begging every day by his entryway. Instead, the rich man doesn't even acknowledge Lazarus' existence. He fails to recognize a suffering human being. He sees him, perhaps, as a drain on society, of no worth to him or the world. After awhile, he totally ignores him. He feels absolutely no requirement by faith or morals to care for Lazarus.

There are so many people in this world who are poor by basic human standards of the need for basic food, water and shelter. 90% of the world's population falls into this category. Yet our society in the U.S. and in so-called 1st World countries continues to cast a blind eye to the plight of these billions of people.

To contribute money to help the poor is seen as an option for a lot of people. Very few are willing to help the poor on a regular basis. Even fewer are willing to take from their own need to address the greater need of someone else.

Jesus and the Scriptures are clear: It is a requirement of faith to love God with our whole being AND to love our neighbor, i.e., everyone, as we are to properly love ourselves. A different way to put this: God invites us to accept and embrace His incredible, life-giving love, to feel its power and strength and, in gratitude for that Divine love, it naturally happens that we love ourselves properly AND we care for those in need.

The reality is that all of us have a Circle of Influence, those people we can impact with our lives, with the full sharing of our time, talent and treasure. We also have a Circle of Concern, those we are aware of who are suffering and in great need, those we can hold in prayer, but not necessarily directly impact with our time, talent and treasure. Throughout our lives, God is inviting us to expand both our Circle of Influence and our Circle of Concern, mirroring God's Concern for every human being and for the environment that sustains us.

The Scriptures present us with an opportunity to assess our Circle of Influence, those we care for and who care for us and others we have had the gift of being able to directly impact. We should also assess our Circle of Concern, being aware of the suffering and causes of suffering in our world, praying for those who are suffering and praying for those who do have the power to impact those precious children of God.
