

Baptism: Please call the church office for appointment at least two months prior to date. A prep class is required. Parents should contact Deacon William Pouncy.


RCIA: Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My friends, the Gospel to day presents us with what can be a confusing story of the shrewd manager who has been squandering his master's wealth and is now being asked to account for the assets his Master has entrusted to him. The manager knows he has messed up and begins to hedge his bets by going around to the Master's debtors and reducing their debts. The result is that he has built friends who he can rely upon when the Master fires him. Strangely, the Master commends the manager for his shrewdness. So what the heck is Jesus trying to teach his disciples and all of us with this story of an unrepentant manager.

As usual Jesus is turning things upside down. The manager has, in actuality, helped the poor people who are in debt to the manager. He has not done this out of the goodness of his heart, but out of hoped-for friends when he loses his job. In a way. Jesus is giving some justification to robbing from the rich and giving to the poor.

Last week we heard the story of the Prodigal Son. A week from this Sunday we will hear the story of poor Lazarus and the rich man. This Sunday's Gospel reminds us again that we cannot serve two Masters. In the case of the Manager, the two Masters were the actual Master and his own greed. In the case of the younger son in the Prodigal son story, it was his own selfishness/ inheritance and his family.

Jesus asks us to assess what controls us or, better yet, what do we allow to control us? Is it money, power, power over others, addictions to drugs, alcohol, sex? Is it unresolved grief, trauma, jealousy, hurt by others? The Gospel invitation is clear: God is inviting, never demanding, that we give ourselves to Him. In turn, he promises us all that we need to live full and happy lives. Not lives that are free of pain and sorrow, but lives in which we can be assured that we are not alone, and that when faced with difficulties and seemingly insurmountable obstacles, He will get us through.

We are called as disciples of Jesus Christ to live our faith 'in the world' but to do our best to not be 'of the world', that is, to not buy into the many false gods that present themselves to us with the promise of happiness. Our salvation is already won by Jesus Christ; however, we can lose that great gift if we fail to focus our lives on God and service to others. God has given all of us gifts to help steward our families, jobs, communities, parishes and the needs of the poor. Are we doing our best to offer our gifts?

I end with this brief bit of prose from poet Antonio Machado: The wind, one brilliant day, called to my soul with an odor of jasmine. 'In return for the odor of my jasmine, I'd like all the odor of your roses.' 'I have no roses; all the flowers in my garden are dead.' 'Well then, I'll take the withered petals and the yellow leaves and the waters of the fountain.' the wind left. And I wept. And I said to myself: 'What have you done with the garden that was entrusted to you?' Gentle Peace! Fr. Larry
