

From the Desk of Fr. Larry... The Scriptures today offer contrasting fomes of prayer. One is prayer that is arrogant and self-righteous. Of course, none of us have every prayed this way. I'm sure that we're like the tax collector who prays with humility, recognizing the power of God to offer mercy for the sins he committed. The publican talks to God with pure arrogance, that he is better than others. In fact, he addresses God as if he deserves better treatment by God than any other human being. He doesn't understand that God cares equally for absolutely everyone! The tax collector understands God's love for him and for everyone. He beseeches God to help him, knowing and trusting with all sincerity that God will hear and answer his prayer.

There are two themes I'd like to highlight for us: one is the importance of humility and generosity in prayer and in life; the other is what lies at the heart of the desire for mercy from God and the extension of our mercy to others reflecting God's mercy to us. Humility literally means to be grounded, rooted. It comes from the word 'humus' meaning earth or soil. Humility comes from a rootedness in faith, an understanding of our purpose in life, an appreciation of ourselves as beloved children of God, and a commitment to generously offer our gifts as God asks of each of us. A truly humble person is one who knows who they are and Whose they are! Hopefully we practice our humility every time way pray. We recognize God as the center of our lives. We express gratitude for all the gifts God has given us to share and the gift of others in our life who support and challenge us to greater humility and generosity. We deepen our humility the more we acknowledge our dependence on God.

We approach God for mercy. That mercy we seek is sometimes related to sins we have committed; the request for God's mercy, however, is deeper than that. Acknowledging God's desire for us to accept the forgiveness He offered us from when we first sinned is just a first step. Recognizing our failings, then, we ask God to help us overcome our sinful habits and attitudes. We are literally asking God to enter into us, to get under our skin, to go into those places in us that require cleansing and healing in order that we can become our truest selves. When we offer peace at Mass, this is what we praying to happen for each other: that God will bring healing, wholeness and greater integrity into our lives.

Our prayer for mercy not only invites God to enter into our hearts, minds, soul and bodies. Our prayer is also to accept God's invitation to enter into His heart, His mind, His body and, by extension for us to enter into the Body of Christ which is our own family, our family in faith, all the needy of our world and everyone else!

I want you to ponder these incredible gifts that God offers you to amplify the love that God has uniquely for you. Humility gives way to greater openness to God and to the needs of others. Humility and mercy open us up to a greater desire to enter into deeper relationships with those closest to us and those we have yet to meet who God will place on our path to respond to. True generosity then emerges more and more as we open ourselves to better understand the heart and mind of God!
