



Sacramental Information



Baptism: Please call the church office for appointment at least two months prior to date. A prep class is required. Parents should contact Deacon William Pouncy.

RCIA: Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

Marriage: Please contact the parish office before setting your date. The Church asks that couples be parish members for at least 6 months before setting a date. Participation in Pre-Cana and a Premarital Inventory required.

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before going to see a Funeral Director. We will accommodate the needs of your family to help you through the loss and healing.

Ministry to Sick and Shut-In/ Anointing of the Sick/ Home Visitation/Receiving Communion at Home: If you or a loved one is in need of a minister from St. Agatha-St. Martin de Porres to visit for Communion, Anointing of the Sick or any other pastoral need, please contact the church office as soon as the need arises. From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My brothers and sisters, today we are invited to ponder two stories about 10 lepers who were seeking to be cured of their disease by one they perceived as capable of doing this for them. The story is straightforward. All are eventually cured of their disease. Only one of the 10, a foreigner, returns to give praise and thanks to the one through whom they are cured. All are cured. Nine do what they are told to do to go through the ritual of going to a temple priest who would formally declare them cured, and thus enabled to reenter the regular community from which they had previously been banished from. Only one comes back and gives thanks. 1 out of 10: perhaps not a morale booster for Jesus who would have hoped for more.

So what difference does it make whether they returned to give thanks to Jesus or not? The difference is this: All were cured. Nine went on to live their lives, perhaps not even thinking about the person who cured them. For the one who did return, he was able to recognize a greater sense of healing and holiness in Jesus as a true vessel of the living God. We can assume he takes the time to get to know Jesus and bond with Him in a way the others missed out on. In this personal encounter with Jesus, he was touched with a joy that would carry him into the future days and weeks. In this encounter with Jesus, He is fed by Jesus' words of encouragement and likely attracted to continue to follow Jesus in order to deepen that feeling of joy.

How many times, when confronted by trials and tribulations in life, do we reach out and ask God for help? Do we believe He can help us? We probably do. Is He likely to help us if it is in our best interests? Of course He will. Do we then just fall back into the same pattern of living our lives, now free of this particular problem, and continue to take for granted the blessings of each day? In today's Scriptures, it would suggest that 90% of just go back to our old patterns.

So what do we miss out on by not making connections with Jesus on a daily basis? I would claim that we miss out on a lot! We miss out on the great gift of daily encounters with Jesus, with the Father, with their Holy Spirit through greater awareness of all the ways that God has been and continues to be faithful to us.

Jesus has no need of our praise and thanksgiving. Such praise and thanksgiving adds nothing to His greatness. What our praise and thanksgiving does for us is connect us more deeply to the God who seeks only for us to embrace, the healing, wholeness and joy that He can offer and that our natural response, then, is to love Him in return through our love of all of our brothers and sisters in the world.
