From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My friends, the month of November is typically the time that the universal church centers us in remembrance and resurrection. With the Feast of All Saints and the Solemnity of All Souls, we begin the month in solemn remembrance and conclude with the Solemnity of Christ the King - King of our lives, King of all creation, the King of unconditional ever life-giving love.

Our First Reading and Gospel for today address both physical death and the continuation of all lives who have bound themselves to Christ. The First Reading from the Book of Maccabees recounts the story of bravery and martyrdom endured by a family who opposed the ruler of Jerusalem's rejection of traditional Jewish practice. This was a family bound together by love for each other emanating from a deep faith in God and God's infinite love for them, reassuring them that, in single-hearted faithfulness to God, God would never allow their spirit to die.

In the Gospel, Jesus addresses the Sadducees, a group of Jews who did not believe in resurrection. Of course, he doesn't directly address their challenge. Jesus rarely answers questions designed to trap him. Instead he raises up the primacy of love over life.

I quote Jesuit Fr. John Foley: "Real love is like a piece of rich earth that nurtures great trees. Roots dig deep down in this earth for nourishment and moisture. The green selves grow out of this earth and extend themselves to reach to the skies." He continues, "Notice something obvious: the earth does not grow out of them! Life grows out of love, not visa versa. Their life and our lives are rooted in the rich loam of love. Love is a force much deeper than life. When life ceases, love stays. It becomes the home, the embracing arms that enfold us. Love is the substance, life is the outgrowth. So the "place" dead persons go, leaving their bodies behind, is into the heart of love, into the arms of God who is love."

Love, as we all know, involves great joy, great commitment and great sacrifice. Jesus, in dwelling among us, knew this well. At the Last Supper Jesus knows that he will be betrayed, abandoned and denied by his friends and then suffer and die at the hands of those he was trying to save. Yet at the Passover meal, out of love and deep commitment, Jesus is saying to us, 'Take my Body, take my Blood! I give it to you freely. Do with me what you will, for I know that my deep bond of love with my Father will never be able to destroy the Spirit of love that binds us together. If you allow me to bind myself, my Spirit, to you, your spirit will be able to endure anything, any risks you take, any sacrifices you make, in humble and generous service to others. "Do this" in the ritual of the Mass and in the fullest living of your life 'in memory of me!"

Today, as we celebrate our very first Unity Mass as one parish family uniting two churches, we celebrate the love of Christ that helped our ancestors, those founders of the various churches. who brought us to this moment to continue the teaching and living of faith as St. Agatha-St. Martin de Porres Parish. We recognize that their sacrifice and honor them in our continued sacrifice of time, talent and treasure to continue their legacy, Christ's legacy, of the Catholic Church on Chicago's west blest side.
