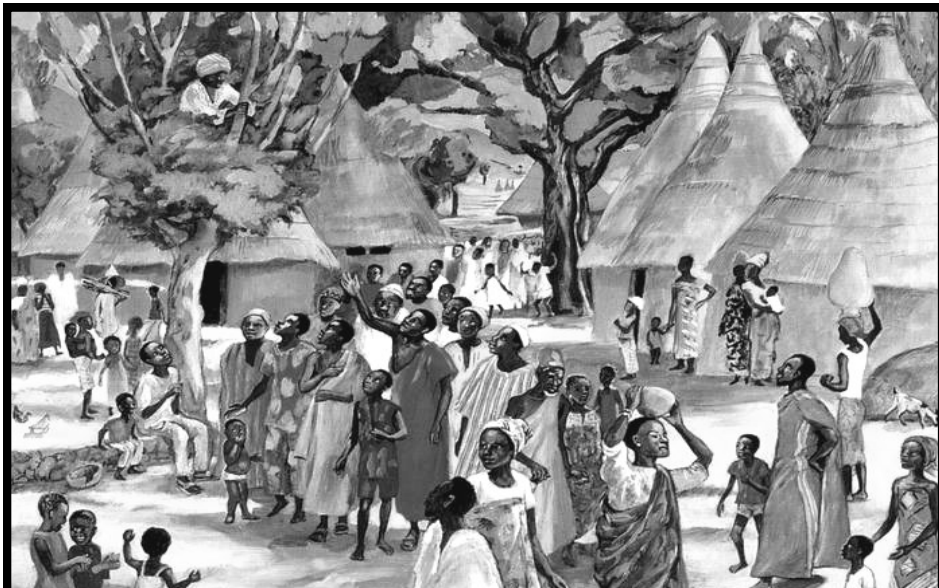

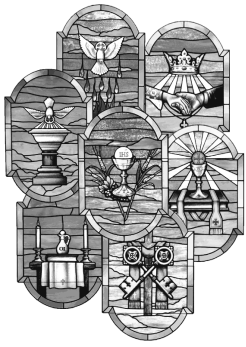

Sacramental Information

Baptism: Please call the church office for appointment at least two months prior to date. A prep class is required. Parents should contact Deacon William Pouncy.

RCIA: Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

Marriage: Please contact the parish office before setting your date. The Church asks that couples be parish members for at least 6 months before setting a date. Participation in Pre-Cana and a Premarital Inventory required.

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before going to see a Funeral Director. We will accommodate the needs of your family to help you through the loss and healing.

From the Desk of Fr. Larry... My friends, today we are met in the Gospel by the character of Zaccheus, a tax collector who, as the Gospel suggests, was a man 'short in stature.' Now Zacchaeus may have been vertically challenged, but we know that he was reviled by his townspeople for his role as a corrupt tax collector. Needless to say, the villagers were quite surprised and upset when Jesus called Zaccheus down from his perch and then Jesus invites himself into Zacchaeus' home. I'm sure he didn't force himself into Zacchaeus' household; Jesus always acts through invitation, leaving it up to us to accept or not. A modern example is that, when we come forward to receive Holy Communion, we are met by a member of the Body of Christ with Jesus' invitation for us to accept His Precious Body and Blood to strengthen us and to bind us to His mind and His heart. Our 'Amen' expresses our wholehearted desire for Jesus to 'come on in' and bind himself to us.

When Jesus enters into the home of Zacchaeus, Zacchaeus goes through an incredible positive change, not only seeking to make reparation for his sins, but to do even more in helping those he has hurt through his actions. Zaccheus was hated by the people because he took advantage of them.

There are people in our society today who are reviled, ignored, and cast to the margins of society. We can list many: those who are homeless, imprisoned, formerly incarcerated, undocumented immigrants, refugees - and those men, women and children legally seeking asylum from extreme poverty, violence from gangs, drug and gun cartels in their home countries.

In light of the current situation with the influx of men, women and children seeking asylum in the US, I offer these questions: Have you ever reflected on the fact that Jesus was homeless, that he was a wandering preacher and holy man who depended on the goodness of others for food and shelter? Have you ever reflected on the fact that Jesus was an immigrant – initially from heaven, then to Egypt, constantly threatened and being told by Herod, some scribes, Pharisees and political leaders, "Go back to where you came from!"

Now I ask you: What if Jesus is everyone in the list of outcasts above who is asking us to accept Him into our hearts and minds, to allow Him to find welcome, hospitality, rest, safety, and the nourishment of food and relationship? Because... this is exactly how Jesus often presents himself to us. Recall Matthew 25: When you welcomed the stranger, nourished those hungering for food, drink and inclusion, when you ministered to the sick, helped those in prison and those who have been in prison to find hope and love in you, "you did it for me." (Mt 25:40)

The vast majority of us are not corrupt like Zacchaeus was. But each of us can open the doors of our hearts, minds and souls to allow Jesus to enter in and open us to new awareness of how we can, with Jesus' help, expand our hearts and minds to a greater generosity of spirit to help those in need.

Next Sunday, the Cardinal has asked us to conduct a Special Collection, for a sacrificial offering, to support Archdiocesan efforts through our parishes and Catholic Charities to help the women, men and children fleeing violence and seeking to start new lives here in the Archdiocese of Chicago. My hope is that all of us will hear Jesus call out to us, "Today I long to enter and stay at your house." And we will answer with joy, "Yes, Lord!" And, as we respond to Jesus call to us to a deeper conversion of heart, we will hear and find joy in Jesus saying to us, "Today salvation has come to you!"
