



#### From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My brothers and sisters, as we get closer and closer to the Feast of Christmas, the Scriptures lead us through the stories of Mary and Joseph as they decide whether they will say 'yes' to be the earthly parents of the Son of God. This Sunday's Gospel from Matthew focuses us on Joseph, the carpenter, the descendant of the House of David, already betrothed or engaged to Mary, now dealing with the reality that Mary is now pregnant and that he is not the father. Joseph clearly struggles with his decision and it is the intervention of an angel, as it was with Mary, that convinces him to take Mary as his wife AND to commit to be the earthly father, guide and teacher for his Son, who just happens to be the only Son of God! We can only imagine the depth of faith and the leap of faith that both Joseph and Mary had to take to commit to this journey of a lifetime.

In our First Reading, the Prophet Amos foretells that God will offer His only begotten Son, Jesus, to dwell for 33 years in flesh, experiencing human emotions, human joys and sorrows, and the difficult realities living as a Jew under Roman occupation and a church regime beset by abuses against the poor to benefit some of the Jewish hierarchy. It was not a pretty world to be born into. But it was real and very similar to the places where many children are born into the world today.

Think for a moment about what God the Father was doing: He was sacrificing His Son to experience the joys and sorrows of free will, to make decisions without direct intervention from Him. Parents can relate to this as they send their kids into the world, hoping they stay connected to them and, at the same time, build their own legacy and offer their unique gifts to the world. Did Joseph and Mary think that when things got tough that the Heavenly Father would jump in and save the day? Maybe... but more likely they knew that they had to deepen their relationship with God and each other to accomplish the task and great honor set before them.

So what does this have to say to us in this final week before Christmas? I believe that it invites us to reflect on the purpose and mission God has given each of us to add our uniqueness — our unique gifts and talents — to the world. Mary's yes and Joseph's yes offer us an example of faithful acceptance of God's plan and invites us to wholeheartedly take on the mission to which God has called us. That mission is individual, but it is also a communal mission to continue to say 'yes' to the unification of our parishes, our collective 'yes' to evangelize, our collective 'yes' to reach out to support our youth and the families surrounding them, our collective 'yes' to extend our love, God's love, to mutually empower families in our community.

My friends, take the time to think about what God is asking of you entering into this Christmas Season and a new calendar year. Is it to recommit to or deepen a current relationship? Is it to take on a new ministry? Is it to seek out more ways to share your passion and gifts? No matter how old or young we are, I believe God is asking us this question, planting the seeds of new possibilities in our hearts and minds. Will we listen? Will we say, like Joseph and Mary, our 'yes' to the journey and task God has for us? Pray for openness to listen, to hear the voice of God speaking to you, directly or through the angels in our lives. I have no doubt he is speaking to each and all of us. Will you listen? I hope so.
