

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

Ash Wednesda

My brothers and sisters, the Scriptures for today call us to seek wisdom in how we conduct our lives. We believe that true wisdom emanates from the heart of God. Because we are made in the image and likeness of God, then that Divine Presence within us means that that wisdom is already in us. It emerges and blossoms as we draw wisdom from our elders, parents, teachers, priests, deacons and others who carry that matured wisdom within them.

Some equate wisdom to 'street smarts'. In many ways 'street smarts' is like common sense, an awareness of how to get around, to act to survive and thrive in society. As some elders would say, "common sense is not so common!"

For us as Christians, God is Love, God is Beauty, God IS Wisdom. As Christians, wisdom is found by exploring the mystery of God, in plumbing the depths of our sacred teachings and doctrine which seek to express our understanding of the mind and heart of Jesus Christ.

The Church's moral teaching expresses the Church's understanding of the nature of creation and the nature of humankind. Church moral teaching, like understanding and wisdom, has evolved over time. The Church once taught that slavery was morally okay, and that the primary purpose of marriage was to have children. Both of these have changed - slavery is morally wrong and the primary tenets of sacred marriage is first the life-giving relationship between the couple, then the openness to give life to children, all in a lifelong commitment. Even the understanding of the theology of priesthood and priestly celibacy has evolved over time.

The wisdom, the moral teaching that Jesus offers in Sunday's Gospel, is meant to become 'common sense', common practice for us all. Jesus calls for harmony in our communities. When there is conflict, we are to face it upfront, seek healing and remedy to any hurt caused, restoring relationship rather than inflicting retribution. It means that there are no winners or losers. It means that we assess and address our own sinfulness, our own imperfections, before we seek to condemn others for their actions. Recall Jesus' words to the authorities accusing the woman caught in adultery: "Let the one among you who is without sin cast the first stone." Not one stone was thrown. The woman was allowed to walk away, touched by the love of Jesus and the encouragement to not commit this sin again. Jesus tells us never to objectify another person or harm another person for our own personal gratification. We are all beloved children of God and, if we view another human being as an object, we offend God who created her or him. That's why I never understand fathers who are proud of their sons when they have their first 'conquest', but protect their daughters from anyone and everyone. Talk about a double standard!

In the Kingdom of God, there are only winners. We seek to raise up the importance of human life and the natural world that God has given us. We express our respect and care for every person - body, mind and heart - including our own. We need the wisdom of God, the heart of Jesus, to guide us through this life and to encourage others to embrace that wisdom, that sacred heart, in all they do.

Lenten Regulations

(from February 22,2023 [Ash Wednesday] to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

"Lent is ordered to preparing for the celebration of Easter, since the Lenten liturgy prepares for celebration of the Paschal Mystery both catechumens, by the various stages of Christian Initiation, and the faithful, who recall their own Baptism and do penance." (Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year, #27)

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer the church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake the serious practice of these three traditions.
