

Baptism: Please call the church office for appointment at least two months prior to date. A prep class is required. Parents should contact Dcn Pouncy.

RCIA: Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

Marriage: Please contact the parish office before setting your date. The Church asks that couples be parish members for at least 6 months before setting a date. Participation in Pre-Cana and a Premarital Inventory required.

Funerals: Please contact the parish office before going to see a Funeral Director. We will accommodate the needs of your family to help you through the loss and healing.

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My friends, the Gospel for today, Ascension Sunday, presents us with Jesus meeting his disciples for the very last time. Remember, in the Gospel of John ,Mary Magdalene encounter the Risen Lord in the garden in tomb where his body was laid. He instructs her to tell them He is Risen and to meet Him on the mountain of Transfiguration where He will instruct them on His directive to them for when He leaves them. Listen to Jesus' final words to them in Matthew 28: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. Know I am with you always until the end of the age."

We think these are words spoken over 2000 years ago are just directed to those disciples, but they are meant for all of us who claim, not just the name 'Christian', but true discipleship in the Lord. First He tells us 'Go'! He wants us to be active in being bearers of the Good News to all who are hungering for the basics of life, thirsting for meaning and purpose. He encourages us at every age to bring our uniqueness and our gifts to help others come to know the love of Christ. As we say in our parish at the end of Mass (which also means 'to be sent' from the Latin 'ite missa est') Thanks be to God... and let us 'Be Church after Church!'

Then he tells us, "Go, make disciples!" Yes, we make disciples by attracting them to the presence of Jesus alive in us through our actions and, when it feels natural to do so, through our words which express that the reasons we do what we do are because we have been touched by the love of Christ.

THEN Jesus tells us to "Go and baptize others." Now, we may say that the only ones who can baptize are priests and deacons. In reality, we can all baptize – we baptize others with the outpouring of our presence, by listening, and accompanying them through difficult times. We baptize others with our tears of compassion, our tears of joy, and our tears of forgiveness. We baptize others when we pour out our souls about 'how we got through difficult times' as encouragement that they too will make it through their crosses to get to resurrection and renewed lives. We baptize when we lay our hands in blessing on someone, touching their hearts and eliciting tears of comfort through which they are baptized into new life.

And, finally, Jesus tells us to "Go, teach!" Teach with our actions, our words, to teach that absolutely everyone has a God-given purpose in life. Every one of us can add value to the world." And here's the kicker, Church: we are never alone in doing this. Remember Jesus' final words: "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Blessed assurance, indeed!
