

Baptism: Please call the church office for appointment at least two months prior to date. A prep class is required. Parents should contact Dcn Pouncy.

RCIA: Adults Seeking Baptism and/or Making a Profession in the Catholic Christian Faith should contact Deacon Greg Shumpert.

Marriage: Please contact the parish office before setting your date. The Church asks that couples be parish members for at least 6 months before setting a date. Participation in Pre-Cana and a Premarital Inventory required.

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My friends, reflect for a moment on this statement: Each of us is created to be a place where God's love can dwell. We are created to be a place where God's love can dwell.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that God values every creature, every human being, in fact, ALL of creation. After all, God created us out of Divine love, and Divine love is always life-giving, both to the receiver, and through the receiver to others loved by God. If God created us, He must have a purpose for each and all of us. God gives us free choice: just as God freely created us and freely gave us His only Son to die for us, so God continues to offer us so much to help us recognize our true purpose and live that out as fully as we can in our lives.

My friends, our world scoffs at the notion of an eternal, lifegiving, unconditionally loving, ever-forgiving God. At the same time, it creates other gods for us to worship, gods that attract us with false promises of prosperity, instant gratification, power over others, gods that help us anesthetize ourselves to our daily problems and the immensity of the problems and pain in our world, gods that benefit those with economic, political and religious power to the immense detriment of others, especially the poor.

Jesus' final words to his apostles in the Gospel are clear: "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father." To make it even clearer: Those of us who claim the true God as our only God and strive to reject the false gods of our culture have Jesus offering testimony on our behalf to the Father. But those who deny God, those who claim to be self-made men or women, those who step on others to get to the top, those who are generous to the poor, to various causes, who do so only because it makes them look good before others, those who give generously to our churches and, in turn, use those contributions to control what the pastor can or cannot say from the pulpit, all of these ultimately deny that God, and instead themselves, claim the highest relationship in their life, Jesus will say to the Father, "I do not know them. They have never acknowledged you or me in their hearts as Creator and Redeemer."

My brothers and sisters, the fact is that we will never be truly human unless the greatest value in each of our lives is to receive the love of God and to carry it to the people around us. What this means for me is that I need to make more time to sit in the presence of the Lord, to simply 'be', to bathe in the grace and love that God longs for me to accept in my life. Like any relationship, it takes time, especially if our lives have been preoccupied by other gods who manifest themselves in the 7 deadly sins: Lust, Gluttony, Greed, Sloth, Wrath, Envy and Pride. God created us. It naturally follows from this belief that God values each of us. The question for all of us is: "Do you value God and your relationship with His Son Jesus Christ?" If so, how much? Enough to recommit yourself to follow Him faithfully trusting, unlike any other false god, that He will be faithful to you? That's the question of the day and really every day. What is your answer?
