From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

One of my favorite church hymns is a song called "Sow the Word." It was composed by two Mundelein seminarians, Keith Zavelli, now deceased, and Steve Janco, still a prolific composer. The words capture the essence of all three Scriptures for this Sunday. Listen to the words of the refrain: "So the Word came to the world, so the Word came to stretch His arms and die for the world. As He loved, so He lived, to sow the Word." The beauty of the song rests in wordplay with the words 'Sow' and 'Word.' The imagery of the verses of the song are taken almost directly from Sunday's First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

Today's Gospel presents us with God as a farmer, a Sower of seeds. The people of Jesus' time would have laughed at this parable. What halfway intelligent farmer would haphazardly scatter seed anywhere and everywhere? The answer, Jesus hints at, is a God who has the eternal hope that every seed - the Good News - that falls on dry and barren land will, with the grace of God, take root, grow, and bear fruit.

We can all too easily look at certain people and say, "They're hopeless. They're not going to go anywhere in life. Why even bother preaching the Good News to them when their hearts are hardened?" We have similar people in our society who would write off whole racial, ethnic and other marginalized groups as hopeless. I think about an early conversation that former Mayor Emanuel had with the late Karen Lewis, head of the Chicago Teacher's Union, who she said told her, "We can only save 75% of our youth, so we need to concentrate on that 75%." I wonder who he would choose or label as the 25% we leave behind. It's hard to believe that someone would even suggest this. Jesus would have condemned such a statement.

Jesus asks us all to be Sowers of the Word, scatterers of the seeds of Good News, of faith, hope and love that can redeem our world. He invites us to engage those people, those groups, who are locked into attitudes and beliefs that are contrary to Jesus' all-inclusive, all-embracing message. He doesn't tell us to avoid them, to write them off. He asks us to take risks to reach out, build relationships without judgment, build a foundation of trust and mutual dialogue, then decide to work together to build better families, better communities and a better world.

His words are clear to those who refuse to be open to listen to the Word: "Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them." "But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it." Will we fully open our eyes, our ears, our hearts and minds to come to understand what Jesus is asking of us and what incredible supports and rewards He is offering us? It's up to each of us to plant seeds of faith, hope and love everywhere where God's love is needed. And I don't know a single place where it is not.
