From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

Last week we heard Jesus describe the kingdom of heaven through the parable of the sower and the seed. In essence, the parable tells us that God, the sower of seed, is reckless, throwing seed in places where no sane farmer would try to plant seed. God is willing to share His love anywhere and everywhere! After all, He let His Son be born in a poor family in a dirty, smelly stable!

Today, Jesus shares more parables, trying to describe the kingdom of heaven in practical down-to-earth stories that the people of his day could relate to. The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed, only to be invaded by an enemy who sowed weeds in the same field. It is like a woman who added yeast and water to her flour, which expands and creates enough bread to feed her family and the poor. It is like one who planted a tiny mustard seed, amazed it would grow into a large tree, providing sustenance, even a home for the birds!

My friends, any of us can craft a parable expressing our vision for the emergence of the kingdom of heaven, the revelation, acceptance and sharing of God's love and mercy in the world. Look at the 'end product' of every parable: something new, surprising, unexpected happens. Resurrection, reparation and a new reality emerges for individuals, families, communities and for all creation.

Here's a few of my own parables: + The kingdom of heaven is like a man who was imprisoned on false charges who, despite his plight, resolves that on his release he will rebuild his life, connect with his family and help others returning from prison to achieve their God-given potential.

+ The kingdom of heaven is like a white woman who has carried prejudice against Black people in her heart her whole life. Blinded in an accident, she is befriended by a Black woman who she does not know is Black. On discovering years into their relationship that her friend is Black, she is overcome with emotion and remorse at her past attitudes and realizes that the treasure of friendship transcends the false narratives and pre-conditioning of racism in white society.

+ The kingdom of heaven is like the young man whose father was not present in his life because he saw his top priority as growing in material wealth, falsely believing that this was his best expression of love for his family. The young man discovers a friend, a mentor, who loves him for who he is, encouraging him to cherish relationships above all else, and along the way discovers his God-given purpose of supporting and nurturing other young men through his strength, vulnerability, humility and kindness.

+ The kingdom is heaven is like two congregations who, diminished in numbers and resources, joins together in faith, trusting that God has a plan to revive the faith on the west side of Chicago. Although material resources are limited, they come together, sharing resources of hope, creativity, a desire to bond with one another, trusting this will multiply into other resources to guarantee the growth of the kingdom of heaven on the west side.

My friends, what is your parable of what could be, your heartfelt expression of what the unfolding of the kingdom of heaven is like? Hopefully we can all imagine and express our vision for the potential flourishing of God's love in the world. + The kingdom of heaven is like a disciple of Jesus Christ who carries the seeds of God's love within them every day and humbly and generously scatters them wherever life's journey takes them, trusting that heaven find a home in the hearts of others.
