



Marriage: Please contact the parish office before setting your date. The Church asks that couples be parish members for at least 6 months before setting a date. Participation in Pre-Cana and a Premarital Inventory required.

From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My brothers and sisters, in the Gospel today, Jesus poses a question to his apostles: "Who do others say that I am?" The disciples have no problem repeating the rumors they have heard. "Some say you are John the Baptist, back from the dead; some Elijah the Prophet reincarnated; or maybe Jeremiah or one of the other prophets." Today if asked the question, we might say, "Others believe Jesus was a great prophet, some a holy man, others a wonder worker." But then Jesus asks the harder question to his disciples AND to each of us: "Who do YOU say that I am?"

My friends, we might stumble with this question, especially if we were face-to-face with Jesus himself. This question is a question about our own faith, our own belief in God and, by extension, that Jesus is the Son of God. Keep in mind our last few weeks of Scripture Readings where Jesus cures people and casts out demons, saying to those he is responding to, "Your faith has saved you." At first we may say to ourselves, "But Jesus is the one who saves. Why does our own faith matter?" A good question!

When Jesus asks his disciples this question, they are early in their understanding of who Jesus is and what faith in Him means. It takes them time to fully understand Who Jesus is and what authentic lived faith in Him both requires and offers. You see, Jesus desires first that we accept His love and the love of the Father. He desires our faith in the gift of their Holy Spirit. He desires our full attention because He loves us unconditionally, with all our goodness and with all our faults and failings. He desires that we accept this life-giving love without question because He offers it to us without question. We need not try to bargain for it. It's always there to accept and to accept fully in our lives.

Our problem, my friends, is that we are hesitant to give ourselves fully to this sacred, life-giving love, because it seems that we are somehow giving up control over our lives. The reality is that we do this every day, giving ourselves to things, people, ideas, prejudices, addictions and other distractions that offer a sense of gratification or happiness, but in the end are temporary and fleeting.

We are made to be in relationship. We are not islands in this world, although technology, poverty, systemic racism and disease has contributed a lot to our isolation. We need each other, so why not connect with the One who created us all, each of us unique, never to be duplicated, each with a purpose in this world? We need each other, so why not cling to the One who can be an anchor and guide Who will not lead us astray? We need each other, so why not put all our faith in the One Who will love us through and throughout our lives, and one day into eternal life? Jesus loves us and, as every encounter with those seeking to be free from dis-ease or despair, or free from the demons or dis-ease that plagued a loved one, Jesus looks to our faith, to our acceptance of His love, to our belief that He is indeed the Son of the Most High to offer us all we need to fulfill our God-given potential and purpose!
