

### From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

I recently read a book titled, "Rest is Resistance." In the book, the author reminds us that we live in a culture which treats most people as a commodity. Businesses want to drain every ounce of time and productivity out of their employees to increase their profits. Our nation's history of slavery exemplifies this, as human beings were forced to work from before sunrise to after sunset in cotton fields, then feeding them just enough and allowing them to sleep just enough to enable them to work the next day. It was even worse during the post-emancipation era as Black men and women's bodies were totally drained of their life-energy, easily discarded because of a steady supply of Black men who were often arrested under trumped-up charges and found their way into working plantations and mines to pay off court fines. The system continues on in the constant and deliberate flow of Black bodies in the very lucrative racialized policing-to-court-to-prison system.

In today's Gospel for the Feast of the Transfiguration, we encounter Jesus on the mountaintop with his homeboys Peter, James and John. Transfigured into His Divine identity as the Beloved Son of God and accompanied by Moses and the Prophet Elijah, they're quite a sight. Peter can't just sit in the moment and enjoy this awesome vision. No, he needs to 'DO SOMETHING.' He rushes around, saying, "We need to build three tents, one for Jesus and for each of his two guests!" Peter fails to realize that this is a time to just be present to the awe and beauty of the moment.

Like many of us, he is conditioned to be busy all the time. He fails to realize, like many of us, that we are first and foremost human BE-ings, not human DO-ings. We fail to realize that we are all precious children of God, that God first loved us into BE-ing, then gave us the gift of work to add our unique God-given value to the world. What the Scriptures are instructing us to do this Sunday is to find more time to just 'BE'. We need to take time to BE in the presence of the moment, in the presence of every sensation that we are experiencing, in the presence of God's creation around us and aware of the presence of God within us, guiding us to faithful do-ing in His name.

Conditioned by a world and a capitalist system that requires our attention, our distraction, to make more money for that system, we Christians have to resist the forces that treat us as commodities, the distractions of materialism, media and others that divert us from taking the time to be with our families, our neighbors, our communities.

I quote from one of my favorite spiritual writers, Henri Nouwen: "The trick, as in most things, is balance. Knowing when to "do" and when and how to just "be." Learning to take our calling and our work seriously, but not too seriously! To let go of our needs to control, to listen for the voice of God so that our actions aren't merely the proverbial running around like a chicken with its head cut off but, instead, are true acts of discipleship that flow from a being that is formed in the awe and wonder of God's gracious love for us." Just 'Being' takes practice. Life-giving rest requires resistance and practiced rejection of a culture that treats us like commodities, always being open to the direction of the God who seeks only that which is life-giving for us and, through us, life-giving to each other.
