#### From the Desk of Fr. Larry...

My sisters and brothers, I always find it interesting that when we make a mistake that is contrary to our own sense of self, a phrase we use to excuse ourselves is, "Well, I'm only human!" As Christians, we know that we are more than human. We are, in essence, spiritual beings enfleshed in physical bodies. At our best, the spark of the divine spirit placed within us by God at our conception, ignites our bodies to grow, our senses to become stronger, our minds to grow in knowledge and wisdom, our hearts pulsing with life-giving energy, our bodies poise to express that life-giving energy through all our senses to enrich the lives and world around us. As the only faith tradition who believe that God actually became human, one like all of us, we cannot deny the sacredness of both spirit and flesh.

Yet, as we all know, with God's gift of free will, that temptations toward self-gratification, superiority, pride and other sins are often manifested through flesh and a negative spirit.

The Scriptures for today offer us the classic formula for how to deal with interpersonal conflict. Recognizing that sometimes it is 'all too human' to hurt each other, Jesus tells us that we must step back and draw on the divine spirit within us, on our rootedness in faith as part of a faith community or even just the human community, and seek to peacefully resolve the conflict. The formula: First recognize that the Holy Spirit of Jesus is a 'third-party' in every conversation. Sometimes we need to be very deliberate about recognizing this Holy Presence there to keep us centered and to acknowledge the Spirit's needed presence in this moment of hoped-for reconciliation and repair. It is also a space where we need to eventually acknowledge how rules were broken, acknowledge the harm that was done, and recognize God's desire that our relationship may be renewed and strengthened to get us back on track to accomplish our unique God-given purpose.

In conflict, we can easily name the rules that were broken, but ultimately all the rules come down to what the second reading reminds us: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" I can think of times that I was working on a project with someone who was just as passionate as I was about accomplishing the goal we had set out. At points, our passion would clash, oftentimes due to creative differences, the pressures of time, and/or just being tired. Over time, we were able to actually dedicate time, listen and talk things out, moving to overall satisfaction in what we accomplished.

One key aspect about conflict resolution is an openness of those involved to resolve the issues. This doesn't always happen, thus the need, as the Gospel tells us, to invite others into the conversation. Conflict always presents opportunities for learning a growth for all parties involved. "To err is human, to forgive divine." Saying it a little bit differently, "To mess up is part of human freedom, to be open and work toward reconciliation, healing and repair, is recognizing and inviting the divine spirit within us to overrule and destructive human inclination.
